California Reopens





Going Away on Vacation? Schedule a Vacation Check




With the state opening up and pandemic related restrictions loosening, we are all ready for a vacation! Making the trip fun and enjoyable for everyone is, of course, the main priority. But just as important to the success of your trip will be steps you take to make it a safe one.

It is important to make your house look like you never left:

- Keep shades and blinds in normal position.
- Don't stop mail and newspapers; ask a neighbor to pick them up
- Put several household lights on timers and have them go on and off at normal times.
- Make sure all doors and windows are locked and activate your home alarm if you have one.
- Ask a neighbor to keep an eye on your house and possibly park a car in your driveway.

The City, in conjunction with the Sheriff's Department, offers "Vacation Checks" for residents while they are away. Deputies will stop by homes several times while you are gone. In addition to a visual inspection, Deputies may walk your property and check windows and door locks. To request a "Vacation Check," send an e-mail to staff@hiddenhillscity.org. Make sure to include your address, dates of your trip, your contact info, and contact info of someone not on your trip. City staff will forward to the Sheriff's Department to schedule your vacation check.

Fourth of July Pet Safety Tips



The Fourth of July is one of the busiest times for the County of Los Angeles Department of Animal Care and Control. Pet owners are reminded that extra precautions are necessary in order to protect pets during Fourth of July celebrations.

To ensure the safety of your pets, here are a few tips:

- Make sure your pet has a collar and tags with your personal information. Include a phone number where you can be reached.
- Get your pet microchipped and please verify the information for that microchip is correct.
- Keep your pets indoors in a cool, comfortable place with some "white noise" distraction.
- Your pets may want to hide; allow them access to a room away from windows.
- If your dog is outside, make sure all gates are closed and locked and fencing is secure. Your dog may try to escape if he becomes startled.
- Do not take your pets outdoor when enjoying fireworks. The noise and other activities at these events can easily surprise and frighten your dog or cat.
- If you are leaving town for the weekend and cannot take your pets with you, make sure you leave them with someone who will be cautious during the Fourth of July celebrations.
- Talk to your veterinarian and get medications if needed.

Conserve Water: Tighten Up Your Residential Use

The Las Virgenes Municipal Water District recently initiated its Water Shortage Contingency Plan at Stage 1 which places a renewed focus on assisting, educating, and inspiring customers to use water wisely, day in and day out.

"We are not experiencing water shortages this year due to the drought," explained District General Manager David Pedersen. "However, conditions could change quickly next year if we have another dry winter. Now is the time to remind our customers that efficient water use is important for everyone to avoid the potential of future shortages."

What Can You Do?

Customers are being asked to tighten up their residential water use – especially for outdoor irrigation - to avoid future shortages. Visit the District's website for tips on efficient water use and more at www.lvmwd.com/conservation.

Helpful Hints:

- Nearly 80% of the water consumed in our area is used outdoors. Some simple, well-planned programming of your irrigation system can save water and money.
- Make a quick survey of your irrigation system every month or so. Check for leaks, broken sprinkler heads, and water streams that are off target. Broken sprinklers are water wasters.
- Lawns are water hogs. It takes more water per square inch to grow lawn than almost any other planting – about 50 inches of water every year. Limit grass to areas where people walk or play. Use other, less thirsty plants for broad landscape areas.



City Council Updates

At their meeting on June 14th, the City Council approved the sending of a letter to the State Legislature regarding additional pandemic funding relief, adopted a Resolution expressing a vote of no confidence in Los Angeles County District Attorney George Gascón, reviewed and discussed the City Budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 and a proposed fiscal reserve policy and placed both items on the next meeting agenda for formal approval, adopted a Resolution that lists projects for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 funded by

SB1: The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, and approved the second amendment to the amended and restated employment agreement with the City Manager.

The Hidden Hills City Council meets on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month. City Council meetings start at 5:30 pm and can be watched on Channel 3 (Charter/Spectrum Cable) or web streamed via the City website.
