# Back to School at Round Meadow Elementary


The first day of school at Round Meadow Elementary is coming up on Wednesday, August 24th. As students prepare to go back to the classroom, we would like to remind all parents and drivers about traffic safety in front of the school. Residents are asked to remain patient while driving through this area as the first month of school is traditionally more impacted with traffic.

Several years ago, the City collaborated with the Las Virgenes Unified School District, the Hidden Hills Community Association, and the Sheriff's Department to establish a traffic flow pattern to ensure the safety of students and to ease the congestion caused by drop-off and pick-up daily at the school. Please see the following rules surrounding drop-off/pick-up to the right.



## Drop-Off/Pick-Up Circles

There are two drop-off/pick-up circles at the school. The original drop-off circle is at the front of the school near the Round Meadow Gate. In 2019, the City and School District collaborated to construct a second drop-off circle along the school's baseball field. This new area alleviated pressure from the original drop-off lane. Round Meadow families should check with the school to find out which drop-off area is designated for their grade level.



### Round Meadow Parking Lot

- The Round Meadow parking lot is not a drop off area, it is for parking only. Parents who wish to walk their student to campus may park here and cross at the crosswalk.
- Vehicles entering from Mureau Road wishing to park in the parking lot must use the right lane and turn right into the parking lot.
- Through traffic from the parking lot to the front of school drop-off area is prohibited.

Please remember, the speed limit in the school zone is 15 MPH when children are present. The Sheriff's Department will enforce all traffic laws.

Residents are strongly encouraged to stay within the City gates and park and walk to the school to pick up their students whenever possible.

- Remember to park parallel, not angled, in the parkways.
- Children may not enter or exit a vehicle that is stopped in the street.
- Be advised there is no right turn into the Round Meadow School driveway when exiting Round Meadow gate during school hours.

## Get Your Dogs and Cats Licensed

Dog and cat licenses are an important means of identification and ensure that your pets are up to date with their vaccination against rabies. Moreover, all dogs and cats in Hidden Hills are required to be licensed by the County of Los Angeles.

The Department of Animal Care and Control is waiving late fees for renewed or new licenses purchased between August 1, 2022 - October 31, 2022. Reduced license fees are available for senior citizens (age 60 or older) and disabled military veterans.

# City of Hidden Hills General Municipal Election – November 8, 2022



The Statewide General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 8th, 2022. The City of Hidden Hills will, on the same day, be holding a General Municipal Election for the purpose of electing three (3) members of the City Council, each to a four-year term.

## Are You Interested in Becoming a City Council Member?

### ELIGIBILITY

- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Must be a resident of Hidden Hills
- Must be registered to vote in the City of Hidden Hills. Visit [lavote.gov/vrstatus](http://lavote.gov/vrstatus) to check your voter registration status.

### NOMINATION TIMELINE:

Nomination for City Council office will run through August 12th. If one or more incumbents do not seek re-election, the nomination period will be extended through August 17th. Paperwork includes a nomination petition and requires a minimum of 20 signatures from Hidden Hills registered voters nominating a candidate for office. You may collect up to 30 signatures; it is highly recommended that those seeking a nomination for City Council collect all 30 signatures and turn in paperwork prior to the deadline mentioned above.

## City Council UPDATES

At their meeting on June 27th, the City Council adopted the fiscal year 2022-23 budget and the City's pay/salary schedule, approved an amendment to the Employee Agreement between the City and the City Manager, and approved two proposals and payments of deposits to Bella Donna Special Events and A Rental Connection for the 2022 Fiesta.

At their meeting on July 11th, the City Council adopted the 2021-2029 Housing Element, approved revised speed hump policies, guidelines and procedures, approved an agreement with Lanspeed for the Server to Cloud Migration project and the purchase of three new workstations for City staff, and approved an agreement with StudioMA to provide a design and concept renderings for the City Hall Landscape Per Capita Project.

The Hidden Hills City Council meets on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month. City Council meetings start at 5:30 p.m. and can be watched on Channel 3 (Charter/Spectrum Cable) or web streamed via the City website.

The City Council will not hold a regular meeting on August 8th.

## Hacks For Keeping Mosquitos Away

In the heat of summer, warm weather and standing water can create ideal conditions for mosquito breeding. The City encourages residents to protect themselves from mosquito bites and mosquito-borne diseases.

### Follow these tips to keep mosquitoes away:

- Eliminate all sources of standing water on your property. Mosquitoes can lay eggs in very small amounts of standing water, including sources as small as a bottle cap.
- Make sure to keep the screens closed on windows and doors.
- Apply insect repellents containing active ingredients such as DEET, picaridin, or oil of lemon eucalyptus.
- Cover up and dress in long sleeves and pants while outdoors.
