CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

It was pointed out that the Las Virgenes Malibu Council of Governments, of which the City is a part of, brings bills to the cities in our region that could affect them; however there are so many bills that it might be suggested that our local Senator Stern or the Director of the League of California cities bring such bills affecting our region to the attention of the COG.
