#### 10. EMERGENCY SERVICES

Area B Issues

Area B encompasses all eight area cities. National incident training must be completed. Basic SEMS training needs to be completed by October 2006 and will be done within the Area B cities. The County Health Department sent out a bulletin on anthrax and will be giving citral to key personnel within the cities. The price for the red, green and yellow emergency flags will be \$5,700.00. The Hidden Hills Boy Scout Troop #642 will be packaging them for community service. It was moved by Commissioner Nussbaum and seconded by Commissioner Falotico to approve the bid. Motion passed unanimously.

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There was a discussion regarding the new configuration of the Long Valley gate. The satellite phones have not yet been activated. The laptop computers were also discussed. Commissioner Deitch suggested some less expensive options i.e. a pocket PC through Sprint for use in the field. Chairman Doran will check on the status of the satellite computer as it has not been delivered and installed yet. The letter to be sent to seniors and disabled residents is being prepared. Commissioner Falotico will check on its status.
